PTC Motion

As per the PTC Bylaw section regarding funding requests over \$500 which are received after the school year budget has been approved, notice is hereby provided to all current and prospective members of the PTC that a vote will be taken at the meeting on February 5 on the following motion: Allocate \$6500 from reserve funds, with an additional \$6500 provided and reimbursed by school tech committee fundraiser to kick-start the LdV technology initiative for the purchase of a Chromebook cart.

Background: A request was received by the PTC to allocate \$13,000 to purchase 35 Chromebooks for school-wide use. In response, the PTC formed a committee to review the request and make a recommendation for the PTC to consider. As a result, the PTC is recommending this motion to fund the request, with half of the purchase to be repaid by fundraisers held by the school specifically to raise money for technology purposes.

If you are interested in participating in the discussion of this motion, please plan to attend the PTC meeting on February 5. The meeting is open for all to attend, but only members of the PTC may vote. (You may join the PTC at any time. Enrollment forms are in the front office and the cost is \$10 per individual, \$15 for family.)



From the Office Please Bring Your ID

If you are taking your child for early dismissal or are sending someone from your emergency card list, please note ID will be required. It is school policy to show proper ID before a student is released. It is for the safety of your child, please do not grouse at the staff who are keeping our children safe!

Allergy Alert

For the safety and consideration of our students with severe nut allergies we are striving to become a "nut free campus." Thank you for your support of our efforts.

Did You Know...

When your child has chicken pox, a skin rash, lice or other infectious health challenges you need to follow up with the main office when your child returns to campus. A doctor's note that the child has been treated and is okay to be back among our other students after a rash or chicken pox is required by SCUSD health services.

No More Extra Buttons! Attendance News

Now you can simply dial 557-0389 and leave your child's absence information.

Wondering about attendance codes? P = Personal absence – Education Code section 46014 is for: student's court appearance (requires verification), funeral services (one day, in state...three days, out of state; need verification such as a funeral program or name and address of the funeral home), parent's employment conference (requires prior principal approval), student is the custodial parent of a child who is ill or has a medical appointment during school hours. Observance of a religious holiday or ceremony (recommend 3 days advance notice to school).

Fingerprinting Requirements: Yes, you do need to be fingerprinted to go on a field trip... whether you are driving children or not. The District requires any adult who is not fingerprinted to be in sight of a certificated person at all times, but it is vital that teachers be free to watch their students, not the grown ups who are there to help. So fingerprint please!

What Time Does Your Child Get to School? School begins at 9 am. Unless your child attends a before school class or breakfast, our campus is not open until 8:30 am. Please do not leave children without adult supervision before 8:30 am.

Where Do You Drop Off? If you are dropping off in the back parking lot, are you stopping at the gate openings with your car and blocking the entrance for others (children and parents) who are walking into school? Please pay attention to where you stop, and especially as you pull away. Lots of humans use the parking lot and appreciate your full attention!

Please do not allow your children to walk through our parking lots! Small unaccompanied children are hard to see.

How Do You Get Here? If you are driving your children to school and come in from Freeport Blvd, do you know you are supposed to take a quick right and come to the school on Shielah Way, enter through the back gate and then drive away on Stacia Way. This keeps the traffic flowing and is easier on our neighbors. Thank you for going with the flow!

Notice of Pesticide/Herbicide Use: LdV is scheduled for service by SCUSD's Small Grass Crew weekly. The crew may or may not spray every Wednesday. If they do spray, they will post notice in the front lower window of the front door. A copy of SCUSD's Pest Management Program listing all chemicals applied to all sites is available in the front office.

Attendance: Students are allowed 10 excused (illness with a parent's excuse, death in immediate family, child's appearance in court) absences per the year. Each additional absence from illness must have a doctor's note to be cleared.

Call In Sick and Tardy: Please phone in your students' absences and tardies by calling 557-0389 and leave the child's name, room number, date of absence and reason for being out of school (i.e.: illness, doctor appointment, religious, out of town, death in family). Absence verification must be made daily.

You may also send your notification by email to sally-uhlig@scusd.edu. Unverified absences will result in truancies.

Llamada para avisar de enfermedad o retraso: Favor de llamar a 557-0389 para avisar que su hijo/a va a estar ausente o va a llegar tarde. Deje su nombre, el nombre de su hijo/a, el número del salon, el día de ausencia o retraso, y la razón ("está enfermo/a", "tiene una cita con el doctor", tiene un funeral familiar", etcetera es suficiente). Le pedimos que llame antes de las 10:00 de la mañana para evitar una ausencia sin escusa.

Late to School? Students who are over 30 minutes tardy must be accompanied to the main office by their parent or guardian to obtain a tardy slip. All tardies over 30 minutes must have a parent signature or an official doctors note. Three tardies over 30 minutes without such documentation will result in a truancy notice.

Badges: Every parent on campus must sign in to the main office. If you are working anywhere on campus get a "Volunteer" badge and sign in the Volunteer book. If you are visiting a classroom, please sign in the book under Mona Lisa and wear a "Visitor" badge. Please sign out in the appropriate book before leaving. These precautions are for the safety of everyone on campus.





Dear Parents/Guardians:

The Open Enrollment process is an opportunity for each student who resides permanently within the boundaries of the Sacramento City Unified School District to apply for enrollment in participating Middle or High schools within the district, based on space availability for the 2014-2015 school year. Parents or guardians will need to complete an application in order for their children to attend the "school of choice" requested.

- Application Process and Open Enrollment Dates: Parents/guardians of middle and high school students interested in open enrollment can apply on-line or in person.
 - Parents will be able to access the 24 hour on-line application at www.scusd.edu. Go to the Open Enrollment link beginning at 8:00 a.m. Monday, January 27 through Tuesday, February 11, 2014 until 5:00 p.m.
 - If you wish to apply in-person, you may do so at the Enrollment Center located at 5601 47th Avenue. The in-person application period will be held on: Wednesday, February 5, 2014 9 a.m. - 3 p.m.

Thursday, February 6, 2014 12 p.m. - 5 p.m.

Friday, February 7, 2014 9 a.m. - 11 a.m.

- Lottery Process: Open Enrollment is not a first-come, first-serve basis. Open Enrollment uses a computerized lottery system to place students at their school of choice. A lottery must be implemented if applications exceed the grade capacity at the requested school. If your child isn't selected during this step. he/she will be placed on a waiting list. If space becomes available, you will be contacted by the Enrollment Center administration.
- Lottery Placement Notification: Letters of lottery placement notification will be mailed home by the end of March 2014. Upon notification, parents are required to complete student registration at the Enrollment Center during the period of Monday, April 21 - Wednesday, April 30, 2014.
- 4. Middle/High School Specialized Programs: Students applying to specialized programs must complete two applications:
 - The SCUSD Open Enrollment application that can be completed on-line or in-person.
 - The high school specialized program application, which must be completed and turned in to the Principal/Coordinator at the requested school site. Parents or students can pick up a specialized application from the high school and /or download an application off the school website.
