Zangle News

SCUSD is replacing its outdated student information program Zangle with Infinite Campus, a state-of-the-art data management system used by more than 2,000 school districts across the country. Infinite Campus rolls out on April 21. The switch to Infinite Campus is necessary because Zangle's parent company is no longer in business. Right now, SCUSD is operating Zangle without service support, maintenance or new upgrades.

Fortunately, Infinite Campus is very easy to use, can be accessed from anywhere and has a mobile app so parents can check attendance and grades with their phones.

Funding for Infinite Campus is coming from Measure Q, a bond measure passed by voters in

November 2012.

Under SCUSD's implementation timeline, Zangle will be available for use until 5 p.m. on April 11. Neither Infinite Campus nor Zangle will be available April 12-20 (Spring Break) for the transition to the new system.

Are The New Online Tests Really Different?

Starting next month, SCUSD students will join thousands across California participating in a practice run of new online tests that will eventually replace the paper-and-pencil California Standards Tests (CSTs). The new tests, called Smarter Balanced Assessments, allow students to demonstrate what they are learning through writing and by solving complex problems, which makes them different from the multiple-choice, bubble-in CSTs.

For example, consider this released test question from the fourth grade math CST:

Which decimal should replace the question mark to have the numbers in order from least to greatest?

- 0.28
- 0.32
- 0.54
- ? • 0.86

Is the answer: A) 0.24 B) 0.45 C) 0.61 or D) 0.93?

To compare this question to a Smarter Balanced Assessment math question, go to http://sampleitems.smarterbalanced.org/ itempreview/sbac/index.htmhere.

The Smarter Balanced Assessments are aligned to the new Common Core State Standards, which define what students should know and be able to do at every grade level.

Common Core Standards focus on skills in addition to content, and challenge students to think critically, solve problems, analyze text and create written arguments. The standards are generally more demanding and rigorous than the outgoing California Content Standards.

To take a full Smarter Balanced Practice Test, go to http://www.scusd.edu/changesstate-testing.

This year's spring testing is a "test of the test" aimed at providing the state with information about which questions fairly and equitably allow students to demonstrate what they know. It also allows schools to learn



Arugula and Fava Bean Dip with Crostini

Epicurious Makes 8 servings

Ingredients

- 1 cup shelled fresh fava beans 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ pounds in pods) Or shelled fresh or frozen edamame $\frac{1}{4}$ cup olive oil
- 1 1/2 cups packed baby arugula(1 1/2 oz). divided
- 3 tablespoons grated Pecorino or Parmesan
- 1/4 tsp grated lemon zest
- ½ teaspoon fresh lemon juice
- Mint for garnish
- 1 baguette
- 1 TBSP olive oil
- ½ tsp salt

Preparation

Cook fava beans in boiling water, uncovered, until tender, 3 to 4 minutes, then drain and transfer to an ice bath to stop cooking. Gently peel off skins(if using edamame, don't peel).

Pulse fava beans in a food processor until very coarsely chopped, then transfer half of mixture to a large bowl. Add $\frac{1}{2}$ cup oil, $\frac{1}{2}$ arugula, cheese, lemon zest and juice, $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp salt, and $\frac{1}{8}$ tsp pepper to favas in processor and puree until smooth. Add to bowl. Coarsely chop remaining cup arugula and gently fold into fava bean mixture.

Preheat oven to 350

Cut 16 diagonall slices (1/3 inch thick) from baguette and lay on a sheet pan drizzle with 1 TBSP olive oil and sprinkle with $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp salt. Bake until golden and crisp, 8-10 minutes.


Serve the dip spread on crostini or in a bowl with vegetables and crostini.
