

When we think of schoolwork we often think of classrooms and the things that go on inside them. But class work is only one piece of the puzzle, and some of the most important parts of 'school' take place outside the classroom. In addition to a variety of field trips and extra-curricular activities such as band, drama, and art, some of our children's most important development takes place on the playground. This occurs both during structured PE time, and unstructured recess. That is why I am so glad to see a renewed focus on improving our fields, play structures, and other outdoor spaces such as our Learning Garden.

Walking the playground at LdV in recent weeks I have seen scores of happy students playing on the blacktop, wandering through the garden, and once again being able to play on the play structure and fields. Many of you know that our play structure was closed for several months because of some age-related damage. And our fields were closed for nearly all of last year due to erosion and other damage related to their dual function as a storm runoff retention basin. But now the play structure is being refurbished (with new wood chips also installed) and the fields have been repaired and are open for business. Even the baseball diamond, which has been dormant for as long as I can remember (and possibly since it was constructed), has been refurbished and improved for Little League games thanks to the efforts of Joe Scarpa, Ryan Metta, and an arrangement with Land Park Little League. It all blossomed into a sight I never thought I would see... A few weeks ago both competitive soccer and baseball were being played on the LdV fields at the same time!

But there's more to do. With the continuing increase in the size of our student population, the playgrounds are more crowded than ever. The impact is especially hard on our play structures, which is why we are looking at several improvements to both the main playground and the Kinder play area. The Frozen Movie Night fundraiser already got us some start-up funds for our new Kinder tricycle track. Now, using some Bond money and other district funds, we are in the design phases for a second play structure for the main playground to be located near the basketball hoops. How much play structure we get will depend on how the funding shapes up and how well we do on some of our future fundraisers. And in addition to these improvements, we are getting ready for a major expansion of our Learning Garden thanks to the success of the recent Raley's Reach fundraiser. So you can see that there's a lot going on and more to come. And as always, we can't do it without you, and your generous and ongoing support of the PTC.

Which brings me to my final mention for the year that our general monthly PTC meeting for June will be this week on Wednesday, June 4th at 6:30pm in the LdV Library. Stop by to get a recap on what we've accomplished so far, what's still to come before the end of school, and what we've got planned for next year. Plus we are still looking for a few volunteers to take over for next year and beyond, so please join us if you can.

Warm Weather is Here and YES! We Have a Dress Code

The dress code at Leonardo da Vinci eK-8 School sets a standard that is in the best interest of students and is considered appropriate for school. All students, staff, teachers, parents, and volunteers are expected to be neat, clean, and wear clothing that does not draw undue attention to the wearer. Examples are bare midriffs, short skirts/shorts, tank tops and cut offs.

Students' clothing and shoes should be appropriate for physical activities such as running, jumping, dancing, and kicking. Safety should be a factor when dressing for school.

The following apparel is <u>not</u> considered appropriate for students and

cannot be worn at school:

• Shoes without back and toe support, or with high heels, cleats, or spikes. Examples of inappropriate shoes are platforms, flip flops, slippers, t-strap sandals, clogs, and "jellies." Students who choose to wear "salt water" type sandals are at risk of bee stings and stubbed toes.

 Bare midriff, t-strap, see-through material, spaghetti-strap tank tops, low scoop neck, deep 'v', or tank tops with straps that are less than one inch wide. Shirts meant as underwear that are thin, revealing, or see-through. Muscle shirts with low cut armholes. Undergarments may not show.

 Cutoffs, pajama pants, baggy clothes (more than one size larger), or saggy pants (not belted at the waist).

• Short shorts, skorts, or skirts - the test for required length of shorts, skorts, and skirts is to stand and extend the arms straight down at the side. The garment must be longer than where the fingertips touch.

• Shirts or jackets with inappropriate slogans: beer, cigarettes, insults, money, or promoting a negative or illegal lifestyle, etc.

 Headgear of any kind in the classroom. Hats may be worn outside only to shade the face/ eves.

The best advice is that if you are unsure whether the item of clothing will comply with the dress code, then it is best to wear something else. When students violate the dress code, parents will be notified and students will be sent home until they are dressed appropriately for school. If a student continually violates the dress code, he/she will serve detention and receive appropriate behavioral consequences. Parents will be notified in the event that the dress code is altered.

Thank you for your cooperation, and your good example of appropriate dress for our students!

Bring a Doctor's Note & Leave a Reason

If your child misses school for a visit to the Doctor or Dentist, please bring a school excuse note for their attendance. It does make a difference on a student's attendance report.

The attendance code for a Doctor's visit is "M" which is unlimited and without the doctor's note it is an "A". All students get 10 health absences "A" for the year, after that a doctor's note is required.

Many parents call the absence line and state that their child will be absent, but do not state the "REASON" please remember to so.

Please Bring Your ID

If you are taking your child for early dismissal or are sending someone from your emergency card list, please note ID will be required. It is school policy to show proper ID before a student is released. It is for the safety of your child, please do not grouse at the staff who are keeping our children safe!

Attendance News Now you can simply dial 557-0389 and leave the child's name, room number, date of absence and reason for being out of school (i.e.: illness, doctor appointment, religious, out of town, death in family). Absence verification must be made daily.

Fingerprinting Requirements: Yes, you do need to be fingerprinted to go on a field trip... whether you are driving children or not. The District requires any adult who is not fingerprinted to be in sight of a certificated person at all times, but it is vital that teachers be free to watch their students, not the grown ups who are there to help. So fingerprint please!

Notice of Pesticide/Herbicide Use: LdV is scheduled for service by SCUSD's Small Grass Crew weekly. The crew may or may not spray every Wednesday. If they do spray, they will post notice in the front lower window of the front door. A copy of SCUSD's Pest Management Program listing all chemicals applied to all sites is available in the front office.

Badges: Every parent on campus must sign in to the main office. If you are working anywhere on campus get a "Volunteer" badge and sign in the Volunteer book. If you are visiting a classroom, please sign in the book under Mona Lisa and wear a "Visitor" badge. Please sign out in the appropriate book before leaving. These precautions are for the safety of everyone on campus.

Allergy Alert For the safety and consideration of our students with severe nut allergies we are striving to become a "nut free campus." Thank you for your support of our efforts.

Check Your Child's Schedule

The lunch and recess schedules for all grade levels are readily available on the school website (leon-ardodavincischool.org). If you are picking your child up for an appointment, or bringing a lunch they left behind, it is easier and quicker to find them in class than on the playground. Please consider timing your trip around your child's schedule. Thank you.

Driving on a Field Trip?

The district requirements for insurance (when driving kids on field trips) are as follows: minimum of liability \$50,000/\$100.000 and property is minimum \$25,000.

Your Family Pet Belongs at Home

LdV is a pet free campus. For the safety (and cleanliness) of our community please leave <u>any size</u> pets at home (unless okayed by teacher for sharing). Thank you.

Neighbor Concerns

Our main office has received a number of calls from neighborhood residents. Specifically, the general concerns are: driveways being blocked, cars parked the wrong way on the streets, SPEEDING, driving over/through leaf piles and children running out into the street. 
