Finally, we also had our monthly PTC meeting last Wednesday. It was again wonderful to see so many of you there. It was also fantastic to see eight of our teachers there, along with a representative from the District - Nick Saechow, Director of Network Telecomm and Technology Support. Assistant Principal Ballard presented a revised version of the school's proposal to purchase a cart of Google Chromebooks, and the teachers each spoke of their excitement and enthusiasm for putting this type of technology into the hands of their students (our children!) and incorporating it into their lessons. It was a very thorough discussion and there were lots of questions and comments.

We have now reached the point where we need to decide if this is feasible and desirable for the PTC to participate and make happen. In order to help us make this decision we created an ad-hoc committee of 11-12 members to further evaluate the proposal and identify sources of funding for the \$13,000 up-front cost. The committee is being chaired by Membership VP Cindy Kazee and will be meeting during the next week and presenting their results at our December meeting. There will also be a box in the Volunteer Office where you may drop off written comments. Hopefully we can wrap up this discussion in December and move on to a new topic in the spring. Dear Families,

As a community, I am requesting that we come together and strive to be "nut free". Among our children, we have future athletes, ballerinas, doctors, and good citizens that have a life or death allergy to peanuts. I happen to have a child who eats peanut butter and jelly, daily. I know this change will be hard. After some recent incidents at our school, I think we need to understand it is better for all our children to try to refrain from peanuts. We have children here that can and have recently gone into anaphylactic shock by being "touched" by someone who ate a snack with peanuts. The experience was traumatic for the child with an allergy and traumatic for the rest of the children in the class.

Butternut Squash, or Pumpkin, Mac n' Cheese

Butternut squash, or pumpkin, cut in pieces with peel on.

Olive oil

Pre-heat oven to 375. Brush squash with olive oil and place face down on sheet pan spread with parchment. Bake for 45 min. to 1 hr until tender.

Mac n' cheese

8 TBSP

6 slices white bread, crusts removed torn into small pieces

5-1/2 cups milk

½ cup flour

2tsp salt, ¼ tsp pepper, ¼ tsp cayenne pepper, ¼ tsp ground nutmeg

4-1/2 cups grated sharp cheddar

2 C grated Gruyere

1 lb elbow macaroni

Place bread pieces in a bowl and toss with 2 TBSP melted butter, set aside In a medium saucepan over medium heat heat the milk. Melt remaining 6TBSP butter in a skillet over medium heat. When butter bubbles add the flour and cook, stirring for 1 min.

Slowly pour in milk while whisking until mixture bubbles and becomes thick. Remove pan from heat and stir in salt, pepper, cayenne, nutmeg, 3 cups cheddar and 1-1/2 cups Gruyere. Add roasted squash to cheese mixture and stir. Set aside.

Boil Macaroni according to directions. Add macaroni to cheese mixture.

Pour into a prepared casserole dish. Sprinkle remaining cheddar and Gruyere, scatter bread crumbs over the top. Bake until browned about 30 minutes.




