### Attendance Information

Please email torreso@scusd.edu with your students' absences and tardies or call 395-4635. By email or phone, leave the chiid's name, room number, date of absence and reason for being out of school (i.e.: illness, doctor appointment, religious, out of town, death in family). Please use "absence" in the subject line of your email. You will receive a reply if your email has been received. Absence verification must be made daily. Doctor's notes must accompany any medical excuse including tardies and early dismissals over 30 minutes. Unverified absences will result in truancies.

Students are allowed 10 excused (illness with a parent's excuse, death in immediate family, child's appearance in court) absences per the year. Each additional absence from illness must have a doctor's note to be cleared.

**Did You Know...**When your child has chicken pox, a skin rash, lice or other infectious health challenges you need to follow up with the main office when your child returns to campus. A doctor's note that the child has been treated and is okay to be back among our other students after a rash or chicken pox is required by SCUSD health services.

**Late to School?** Students who are over 30 minutes tardy must be accompanied to the main office by their parent or guardian to obtain a tardy slip. All tardies over 30 minutes must have an official doctors note. Three tardies over 30 minutes without such documentation will result in a truancy notice.

**Planning an Extended Absence?** Your child may have an independent study package if you are planning an absence of more than three days. You must request a packet from the Main Office at least two weeks in advance of the absence. Please contact Oneida Torres In the main office with any questions torresO@scusd.edu

**Student Medications** If your child needs medications during the school day, a new medication form needs to be filed. Forms must be complete before any meds can be left.

### Please Bring Your ID

If you are taking your child for early dismissal or are sending someone from your emergency card list, please note ID will be required. It is school policy to show proper ID before a student is released. It is for the safety of your child, please do not grouse at the staff who are keeping our children safe!

Smile for a Lifetime of Sacramento is a non-profit that provides orthodontic scholarships (free braces) to six children a year, ages 11-18 in the Greater Sacramento Area. There is no cost to those chosen to receive an S4L orthodontic scholarship. Scholars are chosen by a local board of directors and the process is competitive. Scholarships are limited and based on financial need, orthodontic need, and a complete and accurate application. Grades, extracurricular activities, and volunteer experience are also considered in the selection process. Although there is no financial cost to selected scholars, there are some participation requirements. Scholars may be asked to commit to community service hours during the course of their treatment called a Pay It Forward Plan. Deadline for applications is Monday March 26. The district requirements for insurance (when driving kids on field trips) are as follows: minimum of liability \$50,000/\$100.000 and property is minimum \$25,000.







### Where can I take the ATS Qualifying Exam?

### AT YOUR SCHOOL:

In 2017, more than 3,800 students from almost 400 schools took the *College Ability Test*. Check with your school to see if they are offering the exam. A \$15 processing fee is payable on the day of the test at school sites.

### AT SACRAMENTO STATE:

Testing is also available at Sac State on the following Saturdays: January 27, February 10, February 24 & March 10. A \$15 processing ee is payable the day of the test. Contact ATS to reserve your place.

### Costs and Financial Aid

ATS is a non-profit, self-supporting organization and receives no University, federal, or state funding. In 2017, course fees for the 6th–9th grade program ranged from \$149 to \$439, depending on the length of the course. For the 4th/5th grade week-long sessions, course fees were \$335.

### How to Clear Absences and Avoid Truancy Notifications

### **Elementary Schools**

- If your child will be absent from school please contact the school immediately to let them know the reason for the absence.
- If the school is not contacted or a signed note from the parent explaining the absence is not received, it will be marked UNV (Unverified Absence) and will be coded as truant for that day.
- If the school is contacted and the reason for the absence is inexcusable the absence will be marked as OTHR (Other Reason Inexcusable) and will be coded as truant for that day and cannot be cleared.
- A student who is tardy to school 30 minutes or more can only be cleared with a medical note from a doctor or proof of medical appointment for the time missed. If no medical note is provided the tardy will be marked T>30 min (Tardy in excess of 30 minutes) and will be coded as truant for that day.
- Parents will have three weeks to contact the school and clear an Unverified Absence (UNV).
- After 3 days of truancy within one school year (T>30 min, UNV, OTHR) a "First Notification of Truancy" letter will be mailed home.
- After 4 days a "Second Notification of Truancy" letter will be mailed home.
- After 5 days a "Notification of Habitual Truancy" letter will be mailed home and a meeting regarding the truancy will be held at the school site with the parent/legal guardian or educational rights holder.
- Vacations taken during the school year are inexcusable and will be marked as OTHR. Parents will receive all three
  truancy letters by mail if the days absent total 5 days or more.
- Parents are allowed 10 school days per year to call the school or send a note for any health related absence. After 10 days of
  health related absence each additional health related absence must be cleared by a doctor's note or they will be coded as OTHK.

### Middle/High Schools


- If your child will be absent from school please contact the school immediately to let them know the reason for the absence.
- If the school is not contacted or note is not received from the parent explaining the absence, it will be marked UNV (Unverified Absence) and will be coded as truant for that class period or day.
- If the school is contacted and the reason for the absence is inexcusable the absence will be marked as OTHR (Other Reason Inexcusable) and will be coded as **truant** for that day or class period and <u>cannot be cleared</u>.
- A student who is tardy to school 30 minutes or more can only be cleared with a medical note from a doctor or proof of medical appointment for the time missed. If no medical note is provided the tardy will be marked T>30 min (Tardy in excess of 30 minutes) and will be coded as truant for that day or that class period.
- Parents will have three weeks to contact the school and clear any Unverified (UNV) absence(s).
- After 18 periods of truancy within one school year (T>30 min, UNV, OTHR) a "First Notification of Truancy" letter will be mailed home.
- After 24 periods a "Second Notification of Truancy" letter will be mailed home.
- After 30 periods a final "Notification of Habitual Truancy" letter will be mailed home and a meeting regarding the truancy will be held at the school site with the parent/legal guardian or educational rights holder.
- Vacations taken during the school year are inexcusable and will be marked as OTHR. Parents will receive all three truancy letters by mail if the days absent total 5 days or more.
- Parents are allowed 10 school days (60 periods) per year to call the school or send a note for any health related absence. After 10 days (60 periods) of health related absence each additional health related absence must be cleared by a doctor's note or they will be coded as OTHR.
