Attendance Information

Please email torreso@scusd.edu with your students' absences and tardies or call 395-4636. By email or phone, leave the child's name, room number, date of absence and reason for being out of school (i.e.: illness, doctor appointment, religious, out of town, death in family). Please use "absence" in the subject line of your email. You will receive a reply if your email has been received. Absence verification must be made daily. Doctor's notes must accompany any medical excuse including tardies and early dismissals over 30 minutes. Unverified absences will result in truancies.

Students are allowed 10 excused (illness with a parent's excuse, death in immediate family, child's appearance in court) absences per the year. Each additional absence from illness must have a doctor's note to be cleared.

Did You Know... When your child has chicken pox, a skin rash, lice or other infectious health challenges you need to follow up with the main office when your child returns to campus. A doctor's note that the child has been treated and is okay to be back among our other students after a rash or chicken pox is required by SCUSD health services.

Late to School? Students who are over 30 minutes tardy must be accompanied to the main office by their parent or guardian to obtain a tardy slip. All tardies over 30 minutes must have an official doctors note. Three tardies over 30 minutes without such documentation will result in a truancy notice.

Planning an Extended Absence? Your child may have an independent study package if you are planning an absence of more than three days. You must request a packet from the Main Office at least two weeks in advance of the absence. Please contact Oneida Torres in the main office with any questions torresO@scusd.edu

Student Medications If your child needs medications during the school day, a new medication form needs to be filed. Forms must be complete before any meds can be left,



PTC Motion

After a few years of annual budget surpluses, where PTC income surpassed expenses, the PTC has determined that it has sufficient reserves to allow it to help fund some additional teacher and faculty requests outside of the annual PTC budget process, as it has done periodically in years past.

In February, the PTC proposed looking into ways we might help the school and teachers achieve some of their dreams. First a small focus committee formed to look into how we might do this. They developed a "wish list" form that was given to teachers to determine their needs for their classroom. They also met with Ms Davis to talk about her dreams for the school.

All teachers were invited to submit requests for "wishes" that would help enhance their teaching experience, their classroom and that fit within the mission of LdV and the Parent Teacher Council.

Once the list was developed, the committee met to review the various wishes and to determine which ones they would hope to be able to grant. Members of the committee then met with Ms Davis to discuss alternate sources of funding and the appropriateness of each request.

At the April 4th PTC meeting, the committee presented the teacher wish list and proposed funding each remaining request. The total amount of proposed spending is \$25,000.00 and includes items for teachers of all grade levels.

The PTC executive board and any members of the 2017-2018 Parent Teacher council of LDV are invited to vote on this motion at the PTC meeting on Wednesday, May 2, 2018. Sac City Unified Announces Summer Programs for 2018

We are excited to announce new summer programs for 2018! In addition to our regular Summer Matters Program, this year the district will be launching a new FREE Expanded Learning Summer Program that aims to improve grade level readiness for thousands of students in our schools, as well as provide enrichment classes and credit recovery courses. Plans for these programs were presented to the Board of Education last night and parents/guardlans of students that have been automatically enrolled in the ELSP will receive notification letters in the mail and through Infinite Campus the week of April 30-May 4, 2018.

Over 4,300 students from all schools and grade levels in the district will be automatically enrolled in an ELSP course. A large focus of the program is on enrolling students who are in need of additional instruction to meet grade level readiness, as well as enrichment courses for incoming middle school students who would benefit from coursework that will prepare them for advanced learning and specialty program eligibility in high school.

Classes will run from June 18 through July 26 from 8 a.m. to 2 p.m. for elementary and middle school students and June 18 through July 19 from 8 a.m. to 2 p.m. for high school students (high school credit recovery courses will be from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m.), Learn more by visiting the ELSP web page. The web page has details on centrally located neighborhood host sites, frequently asked questions and program details.

Email Sick and Tardy

Please email torresO@scusd.edu with your students' absences and tardies or call 395-4636. By email or phone, leave the child's name, room per, date of absence and reason for being out of school (i.e.: illness, doctor appointment, religious, out of town, death in family). Please use "ab. e" in the subject line of your email. You will receive a reply if your email has been received. Absence verification must be made daily. Doctor's notes must accompany any medical excuse Including tardies and early dismissals over 30 minutes. Unverified absences will result in truancies.

Students are allowed 10 excused (illness with a parent's excuse, death in immediate family, child's appearance in court) absences per the year. Each additional absence from illness must have a doctor's note to be cleared.

Bring a Doctor's Note - If your child misses school for a visit to the Doctor or Dentist, please bring a school excuse note for their attendance. It does make a difference on a student's attendance report. The attendance code for a Doctor's visit is "M" which is unlimited and without the doctor's note it is an "A". All students get 10 health absences "A" for the year, after that a doctor's note is required.

Leave a Reason - We are asking that you email you child's absence report to torresO@scusd.edu as early as possible (before 10 a.m.). Please use "attendance" in the subject line and include the child's name, teacher, room number and the date of illness and/or tardy, and the reason. The reason is very important but does not need to be detailed; a simple "She/he is sick today" will suffice. You will receive a confirmation email. Many parents report absences stating their child will be absent, but do not state the "REASON" please remember to so.

Medications at School

Parents need to renew their children's medication forms every year. If your child had medication administered by school staff last year, you need to submit a new form this year. You will also need to bring in new medication for this year. Health Services disposes of all unused medication at the end of each year.

Pick up & Drop Off

What Time Does Your Child Get to School? School begins at 9 am. Unless your child attends a before school class or breakfast, our campus is not open until 8:30 am. Please do not leave children without adult supervision before 8:30 am.

Where Do You Drop Off? If you are dropping off in the back parking lot, are you stopping at the gate openings with your car and blocking the entrance for others (children and parents) who are walking into school? Please pay attention to where you stop, and especially as you pull away. Lots of humans use the parking lot and appreciate your full attention!

Please do not allow your children to walk through our parking lots! Small unaccompanied children are hard to see.

How Do You Get Here? If you are driving your children to school and come in from Freeport Blvd, do you know you are supposed to take a quick right and come to the school on Shielah Way, enter through the back gate and then drive away on Stacia Way. This keeps the traffic flowing and is easier on our neighbors. Thank you for going with the flow!

Notice of Pesticide/Herbicide Use

LdV is scheduled for service by SCUSD's Small Grass Crew weekly. The crew may or may not spray every Wednesday. If they do spray, they will post notice in the front lower window of the front door. A copy of SCUSD's Pest Management Program listing all chemicals applied to all sites is available in the front office.






