"Screenagers" Recap

Thank you to all the families who came out for the LdV PTC-sponsored showing of Screenagers on Weds., October 18th! This timely documentary about growing up in the digital age provided valuable information to our school community about how screens affect the brain; screen addiction and compulsion; how social media and related pressure can cause anxiety, especially for young girls; and other valuable topics. After the screening, we had a productive Q&A discussion with two local pediatricians, Dr. Lena Rothstein and Dr. Stephanie Yen; Officer Martinez, an SCUSD school resource officer; and our own Matt Bailey, an LdV parent and internet security expert for CHP. The session was moderated by Alex Rechs, an LdV parent an mental health professional. Alex is putting together a list of resources related to screen time to share with LdV families, and we will be sharing tips throughout the year, starting with the tip below.

Most students in grade 5-8 also saw the screening that morning, and had a follow-up discussion with Officer Ley, another SRO; Dayle Rodenborn, a local MSW who works with teens; Matt Bailey; and Ms. Ballard. Collectively, the students came up with a very thoughtful list of pros and cons of technology in their lives. All in all, we consider this event a success that allowed us to grapple with these big questions as a community. Attendance Information

Please email torreso@scusd.edu with your students' absences and tardies or call 395-4635. By email or phone, leave the child's name, room number, date of absence and reason for being out of school (i.e.: illness, doctor appointment, religious, out of town, death in family). Please use "absence" in the subject line of your email. You will receive a reply if your email has been received. Absence verification must be made daily. Doctor's notes must accompany any medical excuse including tardies and early dismissals over 30 minutes. Unverified absences will result in truancies.

Students are allowed 10 excused (Illness with a parent's excuse, death in immediate family, child's appearance in court) absences per the year. Each additional absence from illness must have a doctor's note to be cleared.

Did You Know... When your child has chicken pox, a skin rash, lice or other infectious health challenges you need to follow up with the main office when your child returns to campus. A doctor's note that the child has been treated and is okay to be back among our other students after a rash or chicken pox is required by SCUSD health services.

Late to School? Students who are over 30 minutes tardy must be accompanied to the main office by their parent or guardian to obtain a tardy slip. All tardies over 30 minutes must have an official doctors note. Three tardies over 30 minutes without such documentation will result in a truancy notice.

Student Medications

If your child needs medications during the school day, a new medication form needs to be filed. Forms must be complete before any meds can be left.

Please Bring Your ID

If you are taking your child for early dismissal or are sending someone from your emergency card list, please note ID will be required. It is school policy to show proper ID before a student is released. It is for the safety of your child, please do not grouse at the staff who are keeping our children safe!

The district requirements for insurance (when driving kids on field trips) are as follows: minimum of liability \$50,000/\$100.000 and property is minimum \$25,000.
