Dress Code Reminder

The following apparel is not considered appropriate for students and cannot be worn at school:

· Bare midriff, t-strap, see-through material, spaghettistrap tank tops, low scoop neck, deep 'v', or tank tops with straps that are less than three inches wide. No bra straps may show. No shirts that are meant as underwear that are thin, revealing, or see through.

· Cutoffs, pajama pants, baggy clothes (more than one size larger), or saggy pants (not belted at the waist). No spandex, lycra or other skin tight pants not covered by a second layer of clothing.

· Short shorts, skorts, or skirts - the test for required length of shorts, skorts, and skirts is to stand and extend the arms straight down at the side. The garment must be longer than where the fingertips touch.

· Shirts or jackets with inappropriate slogans or graphics: weapons of any kind, beer, cigarettes, insults, money, or promoting a negative or illegal lifestyle, etc.

The best advice is that if you are unsure whether the item of clothing will comply with the dress code, then it is best to wear something else. When students violate the dress code, parents will be notified and students will be sent home until they are dressed appropriately for school. If a student continually violates the dress code, he/she will serve detention and receive appropriate behavioral consequences. Parents will be notified in the event that the dress code is altered.



# Leonardo da Vinci School eK-8

Minimum hours encouraged for each family per school year: one child-40 hours; two children-45 hours; three or more children-50 hours Parent participation for late-entry students will be pro-rated

All hours (on & off campus) must be recorded on the monthly Tally Sheet and must be documented by: signing in and out (on campus in the front office, at a class or committee meeting, or with the supervisor of a work event); OR a blue verification card (available in the front office) signed by the teacher, class manager, or person overseeing your work hours. Blue verification cards must be attached to the corresponding Tally Sheet (verification cards turned in separately will not be counted); OR the authorized signature line on the Tally Sheet must be signed by the teacher, class manager or person overseeing your work hours.

- 20 hours completed by January 31st of the current school year.
- All parent hours completed and documented by May 15 of the current school year.
- Parents are strongly encouraged to attend all class meetings.

# TALLY SHEETS: keep a copy of your Tally Sheets at home for your own reference

- One Tally Sheet per family per month unless there are two households where the child(ren) live.
- Tally Sheets are sent home monthly with the weekly PTC newsletter. (They are also available in the front office).
- Tallies are due the 5th of the following month, and no later than two months following participation.
- Updates of parent hours will be given out throughout the school year. Families are encouraged to find ways to get their hours, but if you need help, please feel free to contact the School Community Liaison (SCL).
- In addition to your family, work may be done by any person over 18 who does not have children enrolled at LdV. No person can be paid or compensated to perform parent hours.

#### **IN-CLASS PARTICIPATION**

- In-class volunteers must have a current TB (negative) test on file with the SCL. Tests are "good" for four years. A current, cleared SCUSD Sex Offender Check Authorization or fingerprints on file with the district.
- If you are unable to work in the classroom during your designated time, YOU must arrange for a substitute and inform the teacher or class manager.
- Do not bring siblings to class when you are working.
- Field trip drivers must have a current TB (negative) test on file with the SCL and fingerprints on file with the district.





# What is Academic Talent Search (ATS)?

- ATS offers fun, academic, and creative enrichment summer classes at Sacramento State.
- ATS is a unique summer program for current 4th–9th grade students (grade level as of January 1, 2017).
- There are 2 separate programs offering classes: one for 4th & 5th graders and another for 6th–9th graders. In other words, a 4th grader will not be in classes with 9th graders.
- Over 44,500 students have been educated and inspired at ATS since its founding in 1982.

# Why should 6th-9th grade students get involved?

- Experience a collegiate environment, gain self-confidence and independence, and try out potential career paths while being treated like "college students" on the Sac State campus.
- · Learn from university professors, public and private school teachers, and leading business professionals.
- Discover new academic and creative challenges in topics not always available in regular school such as American Sign Language, law, video game design, and neuroscience.
- Accelerate your learning in traditional subjects. Some classes allow students to complete a year's worth of high school material in 5 weeks. Many courses are recommended for high school credit.
- Meet new friends from across the region who share an enthusiasm and desire to explore subjects more in depth.

# Why should 4th & 5th grade students get involved?

- Explore interesting topics with interactive hands-on classes designed to encourage critical thinking, problem solving, and analytical skills.
- Enjoy studying subjects like science, computer programming, engineering, writing, and art.
- Meet new friends from other schools who also like fun and learning!

# How do I get involved? What does the test do?

- Be a current 4th-9th grader (as of January 1, 2017).
- Take the ATS Qualifying Exam (*College Ability Test*), which assesses your reasoning abilities. Students take the test level appropriate for their grade: current 4th and 5th graders take the "intermediate" exam, while current 6th–9th graders take the "advanced" exam.
- Taking the test automatically qualifies you for the program. There is no pass or fail.
- Use your test scores to help determine which ATS classes match your skills and interests. There are classes available for ALL score levels.
- The qualifying test does not affect your school grades or obligate you to go to ATS. It simply gives you the OPTION to apply for classes at Sac State!

# AT YOUR SCHOOL:

In 2016, more than 4,400 students from over 400 schools took the College Ability Test. Check with your school to see if they are offering the exam. A \$15 processing fee is payable on the day of the test at school sites.




