



• Classrooms in the Garden



Everyone loves a grilled cheese sandwich but our LdV students LOVED the Garden Grilled Cheese!

Try it at home with your favorite vegetables!

Garden Grilled Cheese Sandwiches

- 1 Tablespoon olive oil
- 2 leeks, thinly sliced(light green part)
- 1 fennel bulb, thinly sliced(bulb only)
- I bunch Swiss Chard cut or torn into smaller pieces
- 1 bunch Kale, de-stemed and cut or torn into smaller pieces salt and pepper to taste

Butter

Sliced wheat or white bread Grated Monterrey Jack cheese

(I also like to add white sharp cheddar and parmesan to the Jack)

Heat oil in a skillet and sauté vegetables for around 5 minutes until the chard and kale has wilted. Remove vegetables. Butter one side of the bread and place the butter side down in the skillet. Pile a handful of grated cheese on the bread and top with a spoonful of the veg mixture. Top with another piece of bread, buttered side up. Grill until lightly browned and flip over, continue grilling until the cheese has melted. Repeat with remaining ingredients.
