On Wednesday, **March 18**, we will welcome visiting children's author Kate David, who will present assemblies to the K-3 classes.

Last year Ms. David brought us her first book, Murphy and the Magical Hat. Her second book, McKay and the Magical Hat, is another engaging story with a magical theme. In this book, readers are reintroduced to Murphy and meet her little sister, McKay. Sparked from a conversation with a little boy at school, McKay now wonders what she can be when she grows up. Are there things she can't be? As the reader begins the imaginative journey with McKay to explore some of the things she can be when she grows up, they are reminded to embrace and break their own stereotypes about careers. What will McKay decide to be when she grows up?

Murphy and the Magical Hat was awarded third place in the Feathered Quill Book Reviews' Best Children's Book Illustrated category in 2014. Both books were awarded a Gold Medal from Mom's Choice Awards in 2014.

Please Remember

Fingerprinting Requirements

Yes, you do need to be fingerprinted to go on a field trip...whether you are driving children or not...whether you are going by bus or not. The District requires any adult who is not fingerprinted to be in sight of a certificated person at all times, but it is vital that teachers be free to watch their students, not the grown ups who are there to help. So fingerprint please!

Driving on a Field Trip?

The district requirements for insurance (when driving kids on field trips) are as follows: minimum of liability \$50,000/\$100.000 and property is minimum \$25,000.



Our first graders completed their third cooking class and this time we made vegetable sushi! We discussed how rice is grown locally in Sacramento and how Nori (dried seaweed) is made. The students tasted wild rice and basmati (from Lundberg Farms) as well as Nori snacks. After lunch they rolled their own sushi using fresh vegetables and sushi rice. Vegetable Sushi

You will need:

Bamboo sushi mat covered with plastic wrap

Tezu (Hand Vinegar: 1 cup water mixed with 1 Tbs. rice vinegar

4 full sheets of Nori or 8, if cut in half

Sushi Rice (A Healthy Kitchen recipe)

2 C Lundberg medium-grained sushi rice

2 1/4 C water

児 C unseasoned rice wine vinegar

1/3 C sugar

1Tbs. sea salt

- 1. Combine rice vinegar, sugar, and salt and heat until the sugar and salt dissolve. Allow to cool to room temperature
- 2. Place rice in a large bowl and rinse thoroughly 4 to 5 times so that the water is clear. Drain rise completely. Combine rice and water in a heavy sauce pan and bring to a boil. Cover and simmer on low heat for 20 min. Remove from heat, fluff rice, and cover with a clean towel. Allow to sit for 10 minutes covered. Transfer to a large, shallow dish. Add seasoning a little at a time while stirring and fanning rice. Season rice to taste. Rice grains should be glossy and separate. Keep covered and do not refrigerate.

Prep your favorite vegetables:

Carrots, avocado, bell pepper, green onion, green bean, avocado Cut into skinny pieces.



To assemble Sushi:

Place Nori on bamboo mat. Dampen hands with Tezu. Spread rice to cover Nori leaving a ½ inch border at edge farthest from you(About 1 cup of rice for full or ½ cup for half sheet). Place your favorite vegetables in the center of the rice. Using the mat begin to roll with the edge nearest you. Using the bamboo mat as a guide until rolled completely. Gently squeeze the roll and allow to rest for 2 minutes with the seam side down. Using a thin sharp slicing knife cut each roll into 6-8 pieces(Or 4 for half rolls). Serve with soy sauce, pickled ginger, and wasabi.

Announcement of the Upcoming PTC Elections

It is time to start thinking about the tasks that are ahead of us in next school year. Therefore, we are happy to announce that the nomination for the Candidacies for the Executive Board of the Leonardo da Vinci Parent Teacher Council for the school year 2015-2016 has begun and the Elections will be held at the Open House in May. You can truly enrich the educational environment for all our children here at LdV by becoming a part of the board. You do have a voice—so why not let it be heard.

Please nominate yourself, your best friend or anyone you feel capable of doing a great job. Nominations MUST be received in the PTC mailbox in the main school office no later than the PTC meeting on Wednesday April 8, 2015. The responsibilities for each of the offices, according to the PTC bylaws, are:

The President Elect shall:

- a. Attend PTC meetings in preparation for the assumption of Presidential duties.
- b. Prepare the agenda for all PTC meetings in accordance with the Policy and Procedures Manual.
- c. Notify, in writing, officers of their election and chairpersons of their appointments.
- d. Assume the duties of the president in his/her absence.

The Vice President(s) shall, in the following order, perform the duties of the President in the absence of the President and in the absence of the president-elect.

The Vice President of Membership shall:

- a. Serve as Membership Chairperson. Keep a current list of paid members of the PTC, and provide a copy to the Secretary, Principal, and Community Liaison and to each Executive Board member when requested.
- b. Serve as Election Committee Chairperson.
- c. Ensure all classrooms are represented and informed of PTC business.
- d. Maintain PTC member e-mail addresses and distribute notices and announcements as directed by the President and/or Principal.

The Vice President of Education Enrichment shall:

Be responsible for recruiting and advising the chairpersons of the Science and Technology, Arts, Learning Garden, and Reading is Fundamental (RIF) Committees.

The Vice President of Facilities shall:

Be responsible for recruiting and advising the chairpersons for the Buildings and Grounds Committee.

The Vice President of Fundraising shall:

Serve as the chairperson of the Ways and Means Committee.

The Vice President of School Climate shall:

- a. Serve as Teacher/Staff Appreciation Chairperson.
- b. Be responsible for recruiting and advising the chairpersons for the Cultural Inclusive Education and Sports Committees.

The Secretary shall:

- a. Keep an accurate record of the proceedings of all meetings of the PTC and the Executive Board. Provide each officer and representative with a copy of the minutes, upcoming agenda and committee reports, at least three days prior to the next meeting.
- b. Present minutes of the previous meeting to the General Membership for approval.
- c. Prepare all necessary correspondence of the PTC at the direction of the Executive Board.
- d. Keep a current copy of the Bylaws, a copy of the Policy and Procedures Manual, and a copy of Roberts Rules of Order.

The Treasurer shall be the chief fiscal officer and shall be responsible for conducting the financial business of the PTC at the direction of the Executive Board. The Treasurer shall either solely or with a committee whose members have been approved by the Board:

- a. Keep permanent books and records to establish the items of gross income, receipts, and disbursements of the PTC as well as grade level and special fund accounts.
- b. Receive all moneys for the PTC, give a receipt, and deposit them in the name of the PTC in a bank approved by the Executive Board.
- c. Remit insurance premiums when due so that the insurance always remains in effect.
- d. Pay all bills as authorized by the classrooms or Executive Board of the PTC.
- e. All checks require two signatures. Authorized signers are the President, Treasurer, and any two PTC Executive Board members, or Executive Board designees.
- f. Keep the PTC informed of expenditures as they relate to the budget adopted by the PTC.
- g. Present a statement of account at every meeting of the PTC and the Executive Board and at other times when requested by the PTC.
- h. Prepare an annual report as a permanent record.
- i. Prepare all financial reports in conformance with state and federal laws for non- profit organizations e.g., Federal Form 990 and California Form 199. Submit with appropriate processing fee by the appropriate date.

The Historian shall:

- a. Assemble and preserve a record of the activities and achievements of the PTC.
- b. Act as custodian of records and other materials pertinent to the history of the PTC and the School.
- c. Keep pictorial history of school events.

The Newsletter Editor shall:

Serve as the chairperson of the Communication Committee and publish and distribute the Leonardo da Vinci weekly newsletter in accordance with the Policy and Procedures Manual.

CANDIDATE NOMINATION FORM

As a reminder, the offices open for nomination are: President Elect, Treasurer, Secretary, Historian, Newsletter Editor and the Vice President positions for Membership, Facilities, Fundraising, Community Outreach, and Educational Enrichment. Some of these positions have members who are eager to continue, we specifically need Pres Elect, Secretary, and VP Fundraising.

The election process may be waived in the event that none of the nominations are contested. One week following the close of nominations, an announcement shall be posted in the school newsletter stating the intended waiver of elections. If no protest is filed within one week of the announcement, the nomination slate will be considered final.

Each candidate must be a member of the PTC. If you are not a PTC member, not only can you not run for office but you cannot vote for a candidate. If you have not done so already, please join the PTC today \$10 for a single membership and \$15 for a two adult members of the same family.


