Tally Sheets: A September tally sheet is in your first day packet. Please turn it into your child's class or to the Volunteer Office at the end of the month.

Carry Over Hours: Hours from 2017-18 are only carried over to this year if they were worked AFTER May 15, 2018 (and <u>turned in</u>). Thank you to every parent who worked over their requested hours last year (most of you). Our program shines because of you!

First Pay Packets: Please complete your first day packet and return them to the classroom as soon as possible. Extra forms can be found in the front office.

1B test results and Sex Offender Background check clearances: Must be on file before working in the classroom. Fingerprinting must be cleared before driving on or chaperoning fieldtrips.

Please Remember

Fingerprinting Requirements

Yes, you do need to be fingerprinted to go on a field trip...whether you are driving children or not...whether you are going by bus or not. The District requires any adult who is not fingerprinted to be in sight of a certificated person at all times, but it is vital that teachers be free to watch their students, not the grown ups who are there to help. So fingerprint please!

Driving on a Field Trip?

The district requirements for insurance (when driving kids on field trips) are as follows: minimum of liability \$50,000/\$100.000 and property is minimum \$25,000.

From the Office Attendance Information

Email Sick and Tardy

Please email torresO@scusd.edu with your students' absences and tardies or call 395-4636. By email or phone, leave the child's name, room number, date of absence and reason for being out of school (i.e.: illness, doctor appointment, religious, out of town, death in family). Please use "absence" in the subject line of your email. You will receive a reply if your email has been received. Absence verification must be made daily. Doctor's notes must accompany any medical excuse including tardies and early dismissals over 30 minutes. Unverified absences will result in truancies.

Students are allowed 10 excused (illness with a parent's excuse, death in immediate family, child's appearance in court) absences per the year. Each additional absence from illness must have a doctor's note to be cleared.

Bring a Doctor's Note - If your child misses school for a visit to the Doctor or Dentist, please bring a school excuse note for their attendance. It does make a difference on a student's attendance report. The attendance code for a Doctor's visit is "M" which is unlimited and without the doctor's note it is an "A". All students get 10 health absences "A" for the year, after that a doctor's note is required.

Leave a Reason - We are asking that you email you child's absence report to torresO@scusd.edu as early as possible (before 10 a.m.). Please use "attendance" in the subject line and include the child's name, teacher, room number and the date of illness and/or tardy, and the reason. The reason is very important but does not need to be detailed; a simple "She/he is sick today" will suffice. You will receive a confirmation email. Many parents report absences stating their child will be absent, but do not state the "REASON" please remember to so.

Did You Know...When your child has chicken pox, a skin rash, lice or other infectious health challenges you need to follow up with the main office when your child returns to campus. A doctor's note that the child has been treated and is okay to be back among our other students after a rash or chicken pox is required by SCUSD health services.

Late to School? Students who are over 30 minutes tardy must be accompanied to the main office by their parent or guardian to obtain a tardy slip. All tardies over 30 minutes must have an official doctors note. Three tardies over 30 minutes without such documentation will result in a truancy notice.

Check Your Child's Schedule

The lunch and recess schedules for all grade levels are readily available on the school website (leonardodavincischool.org). If you are picking your child up for an appointment, or bringing a lunch they left behind, it is easier and quicker to find them in class than on the playground. Please consider timing your trip around your child's schedule. Thank you.

Please Bring Your ID

If you are taking your child for early dismissal or are sending someone from your emergency card list, please note ID will be required. It is school policy to show proper ID before a student is released. It is for the safety of your child, please do not grouse at the staff who are keeping our children safe!

Badges

Every parent on campus must sign in to the main office. If you are working anywhere on campus get a "Volunteer" badge and sign in the Volunteer book. If you are visiting a classroom, please sign in the book under Mona Lisa and wear a "Visitor" badge. Please sign out in the appropriate book before leaving. These precautions are for the safety of everyone on campus.

Medications at School

Parents need to renew their children's medication forms every year. If your child had medication administered by school staff last year, you need to submit a new form this year. You will also need to bring in new medication for this year. Health Services disposes of all unused medication at the end of each year.

Allergy Alert

For the safety and consideration of our students with severe nut allergies we are striving to become a "nut free campus." Thank you for your support of our efforts.

Fingerprinting Requirements:

Pick up & Drop Off

What Time Does Your Child Get to School? School begins at 9 am. Unless your child attends a before school class or breakfast, our campus is not open until 8:30 am. Please do not leave children without adult supervision before 8:30 am.

Where Do You Drop Off? If you are dropping off in the back parking lot, are you stopping at the gate openings with your car and blocking the entrance for others (children and parents) who are walking into school? Please pay attention to where you stop, and especially as you pull away. Lots of humans use the parking lot and appreciate your full attention!

Please do not allow your children to walk through our parking lots! Small unaccompanied children are hard to see.

How Do You Get Here? If you are driving your children to school and come in from Freeport Blvd, do you know you are supposed to take a quick right and come to the school on Shielah Way, enter through the back gate and then drive away on Stacia Way. This keeps the traffic flowing and is easier on our neighbors. Thank you for going with the flow!

Notice of Pesticide/Herbicide Use

LdV is scheduled for service by SCUSD's Small Grass Crew weekly. The crew may not spray every Wednesday. If they do spray, they will post notice in the front lower window of the front door. A copy of SCUSD's Pest Management Program listing all chemicals applied to all sites is available in the front office.

Your Family Pet Belongs at Home

LdV is a pet free campus. For the safety (and cleanliness) of our community please leave <u>any size</u> pets at home (unless okayed by teacher for sharing). Thank you.



Types of Absences during the Regular School Year

Education Code sections 46010 and 48205 identify the Acceptable reasons for "excused" absences. Students who are "excused" must be given opportunity to complete work which is reasonably close to, but not necessarily identical to, missed work. The types of absences identified in these codes include the following:

- Personal illness (school may require a doctor's note and will require doctor's verification if school deems absences are excessive)
- Quarantine under the direction of health officer
- Personal medical appointment (may require doctor's note)
- Funeral services of parent, sibling, grandparent, brother-in-law, sister-in-law, or any relative living in the student's immediate household (limit is one day in the state, and three days out of state). Any additional days exceeding allotted amount will be unexcused.
- Student serving on jury duty
- Exclusion for medical reasons (not to exceed 5 school days)
- Personal court appearance (requires verification)
- Prior Principal approval for employment conference
- Observance of a religious holiday or ceremony (recommend three days advance notice to school).
- Religious retreat (limited to four hours per semester)
- For the purpose of attending the pupil's naturalization ceremony to become a United States citizen [AB 1593]
- He/She is the custodial parent of a student who is ill or has a medical appointment during school hours (school may require a doctor's note and will require doctor's verification if school deems absences are excessive)

Unacceptable reasons for being absent from school are considered unexcused (truant). They include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Going to work with parent/guardian or other family member
- Going on vacation
- Going to a concert
- Visiting a college not associated with a school field trip
- Babysitting, taking care of other family members
- Under the influence of alcohol or other drugs
- Traffic
- Personal problems
- Repairing car or household items
- Waiting for service or repair people to come
- Visiting a sick family member
- Student refusing to go to school
- Attending a personal sporting event not associated with the school
- Homelessness
- Other reasons not included in the Education Code sections 46010 and 48205



How to Clear Absences & Avoid Truancies

If your student will be absent from school, you must contact the school immediately to provide a reason for the absence. Clearing absences through the school will ensure your student's attendance status is in good-standing. Outlined below are guidelines for understanding how absences are coded and cleared through the enrollment and attendance office by grade level.

Elementary Schools

If your child will be absent from school, **contact the school immediately** to let them know the reason for the absence. Students may be marked as truant for the following reasons:

- If the parent/guardian does not contact the school directly or submit a signed note explaining the reason for absence, the absence will be coded **UNV (Unverified Absence)** and the student will be marked as truant for that day. Parents/Guardians will have three weeks from the date of absence to contact the school and clear the unverified absence.
- If the parent/guardian contacts the school but the reason for the absence is inexcusable, the absence will be coded OTHR (Other Reason Inexcusable) and the student will be marked as truant for that day and cannot be cleared.
- A student who is tardy to school 30 minutes or more can only be cleared with a medical note from a doctor or proof of medical appointment for the time missed. If no medical note is provided the tardy will be coded T>30 min (Tardy in excess of 30 minutes) and the student will be marked as truant for that day.
- Vacations taken during the school year are inexcusable and will be coded OTHR. The student will be marked as truant for each vacation day absent.
- Parents must call the school or send a note for any health-related absence. After 10 days of health-related absence each additional health related absence must be cleared by a doctor's note or they will be coded as OTHR.

Truancy notification letters will be sent home to parents/guardians after a specified number of truant absences (UNV, OTHR, T>30 min) that occur within one school year:

- After 3 days of truant absences: Truancy Letter #1 (First Notification of Truancy)
- After 4 days of truant absences: Truancy Letter #2 (Second Notification of Truancy)
- After 5 days of truant absences: Truancy Letter #3 (Notification of Habitual Truancy) and Student Attendance Review Team (SART) meeting scheduled. The SART meeting will be held at the school site with the parent/guardian or educational rights holder.



Middle & High Schools

If your child will be absent from school, contact the school immediately to let them know the reason for the absence. Students may be marked as truant for the following reasons:

- If the parent/guardian does not contact the school directly or submit a signed note explaining the reason for absence, the absence will be coded UNV (Unverified Absence) and the student will be marked as truant for that class period or day. Parents/Guardians will have three weeks from the date of absence to contact the school and clear the unverified absence.
- If the parent/guardian contacts the school but the reason for the absence is inexcusable, the absence will be coded OTHR (Other Reason Inexcusable) and the student will be marked as truant for that class period or day and cannot be cleared.
- A student who is tardy to school 30 minutes or more can only be cleared with a medical note from a doctor or proof of medical appointment for the time missed. If no medical note is provided the tardy will be coded T>30 min (Tardy in excess of 30 minutes) and the student will be marked as truant for that class period or day.
- Vacations taken during the school year are inexcusable and will be coded OTHR. The student will be marked as truant for each vacation day absent.
- Parents must call the school or send a note for any health-related absence. After 10 days (60 class periods) of health-related absence each additional health related absence must be cleared by a doctor's note or they will be coded as OTHR.

Truancy notification letters will be sent home to parents/guardians after a specified number of truant absences (UNV, OTHR, T>30 min) that occur within one school year:

- After 3 days (18 class periods) of truant absences: Truancy Letter #1 (First Notification of Truancy)
- After 4 days (24 class periods) of truant absences: Truancy Letter #2 (Second Notification of Truancy)
- After 5 days (30 class periods) of truant absences: Truancy Letter #3 (Notification of Habitual Truancy) and Student Attendance Review Team (SART) meeting scheduled. The SART meeting will be held at the school site with the parent/guardian or educational rights holder.


