From the PTC President

Greetings LdV families, friends, and faculty. School is now in full swing. It's hard to believe we've just ended our first quarter. Recently, I've been pondering why, at this point in the school year, so many classes are struggling to find parent volunteers; why voluntary class contributions are low; and why some of our strongest fundraisers did not yield more positive outcomes. Perhaps you have been wondering the same thing. I thought it critical to remind our learning community of a few things. One of the benefits of attending LdV is that parent volunteering and the voluntary supplemental classroom fees provide our children with access to individualized education and learning. These fees and the periodic fundraisers help provide a continuity of education from year to year despite the vagaries of school district budgets.

Unfortunately, parent volunteering and participation has waned significantly this year as compared to previous years. The practical reality is that this means that there may be a scaling back or cancelation of the individualized 'centers' or 'workshops' for grades eK-3. For all grades it means that field trips will be canceled if the trend continues. Even volunteering one time per semester for an hour or two can significantly impact the

educational experience and impact.

Similarly, LdV's curriculum is supplemented with field trips and special presentations. If all parents do not contribute, even if partial, the result necessarily means the cancellation of the field trips and special presentations. Parents who contribute the suggested class fee are not being asked to contribute excess funds. If all parents are not willing to equally share the burden and cost of LdV curriculum, the unique educational experience we are all trying to create will evaporate.

LdV has garnered a reputation and standard of excellence in part because of parent participation at many levels. Please help to keep the excellent programs in place by volunteering and paying the suggested class fees. Thank you —Katherine Barrett, PTC President

Please Remember

When approaching an leaving our campus...We ALL have children to drop off or pick up. We ALL have places we need to go. But the most importantly ALL of us need to be safe and courteous. Good behavior under pressure is a great lesson for the children in your car to witness.

Fingerprinting Requirements

Yes, you do need to be fingerprinted to go on a field trip...whether you are driving children or not...whether you are going by bus or not. The District requires any adult who is not fingerprinted to be in sight of a certificated person at all times, but it is vital that teachers be free to watch their students, not the grown ups who are there to help. So fingerprint please!

Driving on a Field Trip?

The district requirements for insurance (when driving kids on field trips) are as follows: minimum of liability \$50,000/\$100.000 and property is minimum \$25,000.

Email Sick and Tardy

Please email sally-uhlig@scusd.edu with your students' absences and tardies or call 557-0389 wait for the message to begin and then press 49#. By email or phone, leave the child's name, room number, date of absence and reason for being out of school (i.e.: illness, doctor appointment, religious, out of town, death in family). Please use "absence" in the subject line. You will receive a reply if it has been received. Absence verification must be made daily. Unverified absences will result in truancies.

Llamada para avisar de enfermedad o retraso

Favor de llamar a 557-0389 (y selecione 49 #) al empezar el mensaje) para avisar que su hijo/a va a estar ausente o va a llegar tarde. Deje su nombre, el nombre de su hijo/a, el número del salon, el día de ausencia o retraso, y la razón ("está enfermo/a", "tiene una cita con el doctor", tiene un funeral familiar", etcetera es suficiente). Le pedimos que llame antes de las 11:00 de la mañana para evitar una ausencia sin escusa.

Students are allowed 10 excused (illness with a parent's excuse, death in immediate family, child's appearance in court) absences per the year. Each additional absence from illness must have a doctor's note to be cleared.

Bring a Doctor's Note - If your child misses school for a visit to the Doctor or Dentist, please bring a school excuse note for their attendance. It does make a difference on a student's attendance report. The attendance code for a Doctor's visit is "M" which is unlimited and without the doctor's note it is an "A". All students get 10 health absences "A" for the year, after that a doctor's note is required.

Leave a Reason. - We are asking that you email you child's absence report to sally-uhlig@ scusd.edu as early as possible (before 10 a.m.). Please use "attendance" in the subject line and include the child's name, teacher, room number and the date of illness and/or tardy, and the reason. The reason is very important but does not need to be detailed; a simple "She/he is sick today" will suffice. You will receive a confirmation email. Many parents report absences stating their child will be absent, but do not state the "REASON" please remember to so.

Wondering about attendance codes? P = Personal absence – Education Code section 46014 is for: student's court appearance {requires verification}, funeral services {one day, in state...three days, out of state; need verification such as a funeral program or name and address of the funeral home}, parent's employment conference {requires prior principal approval}, student is the custodial parent of a child who is ill or has a medical appointment during school hours. Observance of a religious holiday or ceremony (recommend 3 days advance notice to school).

Did You Know...When your child has chicken pox, a skin rash, lice or other infectious health challenges you need to follow up with the main office when your child returns to campus. A doctor's note that the child has been treated and is okay to be back among our other students after a rash or chicken pox is required by SCUSD health services.

Late to School? Students who are over 30 minutes tardy must be accompanied to the main office by their parent or guardian to obtain a tardy slip. All tardies over 30 minutes must have a parent signature or an official doctors note. Three tardies over 30 minutes without such documentation will result in a truancy notice.

Please Bring Your ID

If you are taking your child for early dismissal or are sending someone from your emergency card list, please note ID will be required. It is school policy to show proper ID before a student is released. It is for the safety of your child, please do not grouse at the staff who are keeping our children safe! Badges: Every parent on campus must sign in to the main office. If you are working anywhere on campus get a "Volunteer" badge and sign in the Volunteer book. If you are visiting a classroom, please sign in the book under Mona Lisa and wear a "Visitor" badge. Please sign out in the appropriate book before leaving. These precautions are for the safety of everyone on campus.

Medications at School

Parents need to renew their children's medication forms every year. If your child had medication administered by school staff last year, you need to submit a new form this year. You will also need to bring in new medication for this year. Health Services disposes of all unused medication at the end of each year.

Allergy Alert

For the safety and consideration of our students with severe nut allergies we are striving to become a "nut free campus." Thank you for your support of our efforts.

Fingerprinting Requirements: Yes, you do need to be fingerprinted to go on a field trip... whether you are driving children or not. The District requires any adult who is not fingerprinted to be in sight of a certificated person at all times, but it is vital that teachers be free to watch their students, not the grown ups who are there to help. So fingerprint please!

Pick up & Drop Off

What Time Does Your Child Get to School? School begins at 9 am. Unless your child attends a before school class or breakfast, our campus is not open until 8:30 am. Please do not leave children without adult supervision before 8:30 am.

Where Do You Drop Off? If you are dropping off in the back parking lot, are you stopping at the gate openings with your car and blocking the entrance for others (children and parents) who are walking into school? Please pay attention to where you stop, and especially as you pull away. Lots of humans use the parking lot and appreciate your full attention!

Please do not allow your children to walk through our parking lots! Small unaccompanied children are hard to see.

How Do You Get Here? If you are driving your children to school and come in from Freeport Blvd, do you know you are supposed to take a quick right and come to the school on Shielah Way, enter through the back gate and then drive away on Stacia Way. This keeps the traffic flowing and is easier on our neighbors. Thank you for going with the flow!

Notice of Pesticide/Herbicide Use

LdV is scheduled for service by SCUSD's Small Grass Crew weekly. The crew may or may not spray every Wednesday. If they do spray, they will post notice in the front lower window of the front door. A copy of SCUSD's Pest Management Program listing all chemicals applied to all sites is available in the front office.

Your Family Pet Belongs at Home

LdV is a pet free campus. For the safety (and cleanliness) of our community please leave <u>any size</u> pets at home (unless okayed by teacher for sharing). Thank you.





Fourth Grade Mission Gardens

Thanks to parents Kris Ore and Char Klassen, Ms Dodd's and Ms. Bustos' fourth grade classes have been working on planting California Mission Gardens. In Ms. Dodd's class the students planted leeks, carrots, beets and peas. When they're ready to harvest they will add barley and beans to make a traditional soup. I can't wait for that recipe! Both classes will also plant herbs and plants native to our California Missions. What an exciting experience for our fourth graders!

Today I'm focusing on the golden beets that Ms. Dodd's class planted. Beets are one of my favorite vegetables for fall season. Not only are they very good for you(high in many vitamins and minerals) but they are beautiful on a roasted vegetable platter, as an hors d'oeuvres, or in a yummy fall salad:

Golden and Crimson Beet Salad with Oranges, Fennel, and Feta

(adapted from Bon Appetit)

Roasted beets(see recipe below)

4 oranges, peeled and segmented (catch juices in a small bowl for dressing)

1 small fennel bulb, trimmed, quartered and sliced paper thin

¼ cup chopped fresh mint

¼ cup chopped fresh parsley

¼ cup chopped toasted hazelnuts

1 small shallot, finely chopped

1 TBSP Balsamic vinegar

2 TBSP Olive oil

1- 1/2 cup crumbled feta

salt and pepper

Combine oranges, fennel, mint, parsley, hazelnuts, and shallot to bowl with roasted beets. Transfer 2 tsp of the orange juice to a small bowl; whisk in vinegar and olive oil. Season with salt and pepper. Stir into beet mixture Mound salad on a platter and sprinkle with cheese.

Roasting Beets

Preheat oven to 400

2 large red beets -top and bottom cut (about 1/2 inch)


2 large golden beets-tops and bottom trimmed.

3 tablespoons olive oil.

Place beets in a glass or metal pan(I like to separate the beets by color so the red beets don't stain). Place 1 inch of water in the bottom of the pan. Drizzle with olive oil and cover pan with tinfoil. Bake for about 1 hour to 1-1/2 hrs, or until the beet is easily pierced with a knife.

Peel beets with a knife or your hands (the skin peel off easily). Cut into ½ inch cubes or slices. Sprinkle with salt and pepper. They can be made 1 day ahead and chilled.

CHANGES TO THE K-6 REPORT CARD

The SCUSD K-6 report card has been revised to align to the California Common Core State Standards (CA CCSS) for mathematics and English Language Arts that will be implemented state-wide in 2014-15. Parents will notice the following on the new report card:

- $\circ\;$ A 4-point grading scale indicating the four levels of standards achievement
- An alpha scale of O (outstanding), S (satisfactory), P (progressing), or N (needs improvement) that indicates progress in the learning expectations for each domain or strand of standards
- \circ New categories for math and English Language Arts aligned to the CA CCSS
- A section on Behaviors that Support Learning reflecting social emotional learning competencies and work habit skills that are critical to academic success

A STANDARDS-BASED REPORT CARD

Similar to the previous report card, the new report card is a standards-based report card. This type of report card lists the most important standards students should learn in each subject at their particular grade level. Instead of traditional letter grades, students receive a mark of 1-4 that indicates how well they have mastered the required standards. The marks will show their level of achievement with the Common Core State Standards. Students will get separate marks for effort and work habits. Standards-based grading focuses on the student's achievement rather than how quickly they learned or how many times it took them to master the standards.
