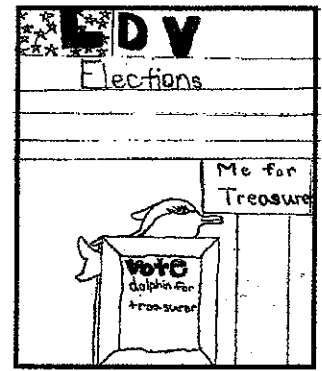

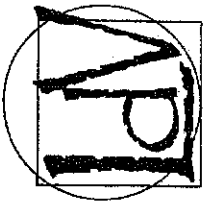

NOVEMBER

Leonardo da Vinci School eK-8

Minimum hours encouraged for each family per school year:
one child-40 hours; two children-45 hours; three or more children-50 hours
Parent participation for late-entry students will be pro-rated

All hours (on & off campus) must be recorded on the monthly Tally Sheet and must be documented by: signing in and out (on campus in the front office, at a class or committee meeting, or with the supervisor of a work event); OR a blue verification card (available in the front office) signed by the teacher, class manager, or person overseeing your work hours. Blue verification cards must be attached to the corresponding Tally Sheet (verification cards turned in separately will not be counted); OR the authorized signature line on the Tally Sheet must be signed by the teacher, class manager or person overseeing your work hours.

- 20 hours completed by January 31st of the current school year.
- All parent hours completed and documented by May 15 of the current school year.
- Parents are strongly encouraged to attend all class meetings.

TALLY SHEETS: keep a copy of your Tally Sheets at home for your own reference

- One Tally Sheet per family per month unless there are two households where the child(ren) live.
- Tally Sheets are sent home monthly with the weekly PTC newsletter. (They are also available in the front office).
- Tallies are due the 5th of the following month, and no later than two months following participation.
- Updates of parent hours will be given out throughout the school year. Families are encouraged to find ways to get their hours, but if you need help, please feel free to contact the School Community Liaison (SCL).
- In addition to your family, work may be done by any person over 18 who does not have children enrolled at LdV. No person can be paid or compensated to perform parent hours.

IN-CLASS PARTICIPATION

- In-class volunteers must have a current TB (negative) test on file with the SCL. Tests are "good" for four years. A current, cleared SCUSD Sex Offender Check Authorization or fingerprints on file with the district.
- If you are unable to work in the classroom during your designated time, YOU must arrange for a substitute and inform the teacher or class manager.
- Do not bring siblings to class when you are working.
- Field trip drivers must have a current TB (negative) test on file with the SCL and fingerprints on file with the district.

HOURS ARE GIVEN FOR THE FOLLOWING ACTIVITIES:

Class Meeting	Length of meeting (sign in at classroom)
Committee Meeting	Length of meeting (sign in at meeting) SSC (School Site Council), PTC (Parent Teacher Council) and its subcommittees: <i>Arts, Science & Tech, CIE, Sports, Ways & Means</i>
Field Trips (day)	Length of trip (sign in, or authorized signature on Tally Sheet or Authorization card)
Field Trip (overnight)	Length of trip including sleeping hours (sign in, or authorized signature on Tally Sheet or blue card)
Food Preparation	Length of time worked – maximum 10 hours per school year – one hour per 2 dozen cookies, 1.5 hours per cake (authorized signature on Tally Sheet or blue card)

Program Policies

- All supplies and materials are included in the class fee. You will not need to provide anything!
- Students will be grouped by similar grade if more than one class is offered; standard class sizes range from 15 to 20 students.
- This is a Mad Science Program. Any questions or issues should be directed to Mad Science and not the school or site organization.
- We will contact you prior to the start of the program to confirm your child's registration and inform you of the meeting location at the school. Please call us if you do not receive this email before the first day of class.
- Mad Science does not pick up the children from their regular school classroom to go to Mad Science. Children must walk themselves to our class. If you have a young child and are concerned they may not know where to go or may forget, please inform their regular teacher and he/she may decide to remind them weekly. If your child has other classmates attending Mad Science, they can walk over together.
- Mad Science is not responsible to ensure that your child attends our program and is not responsible for students who do not show up at our class. This means you and your child must coordinate your schedules and create reminders where necessary to ensure attendance.
- When registering your child you must indicate the method of release you wish us to use. The choices are "Daycare" (on site), "Walk" (dismissed at door) and "Picked up by" (signed out). For the "Picked up by" option, please list the names of all adults who will regularly sign out your child.
- Safety is a top priority with Mad Science. However, Mad Science is not responsible for students after we release them at the end of class. If you will be picking up your child after the Mad Science class, you must sign him or her out at the classroom.
- A \$25 fee will be charged for checks that are returned unpaid.
- Refund requests made before the start of the program are subject to a \$25 processing fee and will be granted only if requested at least two weeks prior to program start. As an option to receiving a refund check, you may apply your remaining credit to another Mad Science after school program, birthday party, camp, workshop, etc.
